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PROCEEDINGS

MS. WHITTLE: Well again, good evening. I'm going to go through just some things that we need just for the record as we go through this public hearing. It is now -- looks like about 6:55, and I'd like to start the public hearing at this point. On behalf of the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, I want to welcome you again.

The purpose of this hearing is to accept comments on the draft hazardous waste permit for the proposed Johnson Controls lead acid battery recycling facility located in Florence, South Carolina. Public notice of this hearing was given in newspaper and on the radio, and mailed to persons on our mailing list during the month of July 2010. I'm requesting that the court reporter include a copy of the public notice in the hearing transcript.

I encourage each of you to provide the information requested on the sign-in sheet so that we have a complete record of attendance this evening. You may also indicate if you wish to make an -- an oral comment tonight where all comments made at this point on will be recorded.

Page 4 1 Stephen Crowell with DHEC has already given a 2 presentation summarizing the hazardous waste 3 permitting process and draft permit for the proposed facility. Now is your opportunity to comment on the draft permit. In order for this 6 hearing to be successful and allow everyone the 7 opportunity to express their views, I will call on each person first who has indicated a desire to make a comment. 10 When you came in, you were asked if you 11 wanted to make a comment on the sign-in sheet. 12 There will -- you will be called on randomly. 13 There will be no cross-examinations or 14 question-and-answer during this hearing. We --15 sometimes folks ask us questions during the 16 hearing part, and we don't answer those questions 17 during that time, but after that, if you still 18 have questions, we'll be willing to take those. 19 Anyone who wishes to submit comments but does not 20 plan to speak may submit written statements until 21 the public comment period closes. Again, that 22 closing date is September 24th, 2010. 23 Again, I mention that DHEC staff will be 24 available after the public hearing if there are 25 further questions. When you come up to make your

NOTICE OF A DRAFT HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT AND PUBLIC MEETING/HEARING

DHEC has received a new permit application for hazardous waste activities at the proposed Johnson Controls Florence Recycling Center (JCI). The permit application has been deemed complete and a draft hazardous waste permit has been written by DHEC to regulate these activities. The draft permit has been written to comply with the South Carolina Hazardous Waste Management Regulations and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments.

The draft permit contains conditions for the following:

- Storage of hazardous waste;
- Identification of solid waste management units (SWMUs) and areas of concern (AOCs) at the facility and corrective action for those units, if needed;
- Waste minimization and land disposal restrictions.

The permit application and draft permit are open for public comment from July 26, 2010 to September 24, 2010. DHEC encourages all interested persons to participate in this permitting process.

DHEC is holding an informal public meeting and formal public hearing to discuss the draft permit with interested citizens. The public meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, August 31, 2010, at the Lowrimore Auditorium, Cauthen Media Center, Francis Marion University, located at Francis Marion Drive, Florence, SC. Directions may be obtained by calling Stephen Crowell at (803) 896-4183. At this meeting, DHEC staff will:

- Give an overview of the draft permit; and
- · Hear concerns and answer questions from all interested persons.

At the conclusion of the public meeting, a **formal public hearing** will be held for interested citizens to submit oral and written comments on the record. A hearing officer designated by DHEC will conduct the hearing and comments will be taken in random order. DHEC values each participant's involvement in the public hearing and will conduct it in a respectful, orderly manner with reasonable limits on the length of oral comments, if necessary.

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Individuals with disabilities who wish to participate in the hearing or review the proceedings should contact Norma West at (803) 896-4056 at least one week in advance to discuss any special aids or services needed.

Written comments must be submitted no later than September 24, 2010 and will be accepted at the public hearing. Comments may also be submitted to the attention of Richard Haynes at the above DHEC address or by e-mail at: haynesra@dhec.sc.gov. All written comments received by September 24, 2010 will be considered before a final permit decision is made.

Requests to be placed on a facility mailing list for notification of future public notices by DHEC's Division of Waste Management should be made in writing to the attention of Norma West at the above DHEC address or by e-mail at: westni@dhec.sc.gov.
